**Residents Invited to Series of Five Community Workshops  
to Discuss Preliminary Designs and Recreation Features for Proposed  
New Whitewater Park in North Palm Springs**

June 13, 2019

The City of Palm Springs invites residents to attend a series of five community workshops this month in North Palm Springs with the goal of obtaining input on preliminary designs and recreational features for a proposed new park, which would be located at the end of North Sunrise Way.

The City is applying for Proposition 68 grant funds from the state of California to design and create the proposed new Whitewater Park, which would primarily serve residents in the north end of the City. In order to receive funding, the project must create at least one special parks and recreation feature. The state grant awards a maximum of \$8.5 million for a new park.

Public input is desired and welcome. The meetings will be held on the following dates:

- **Two meetings on Tuesday, June 25 at 3:30 p.m. and at 5:30 p.m. at Vista Del Monte Elementary, School Multi-Purpose Room, 2744 N. Via Miraleste**
- **Saturday, June 29, 10 a.m. Meeting at the proposed site for the Whitewater Park, located at the north end of North Sunrise Way, just past Four Seasons Boulevard**
