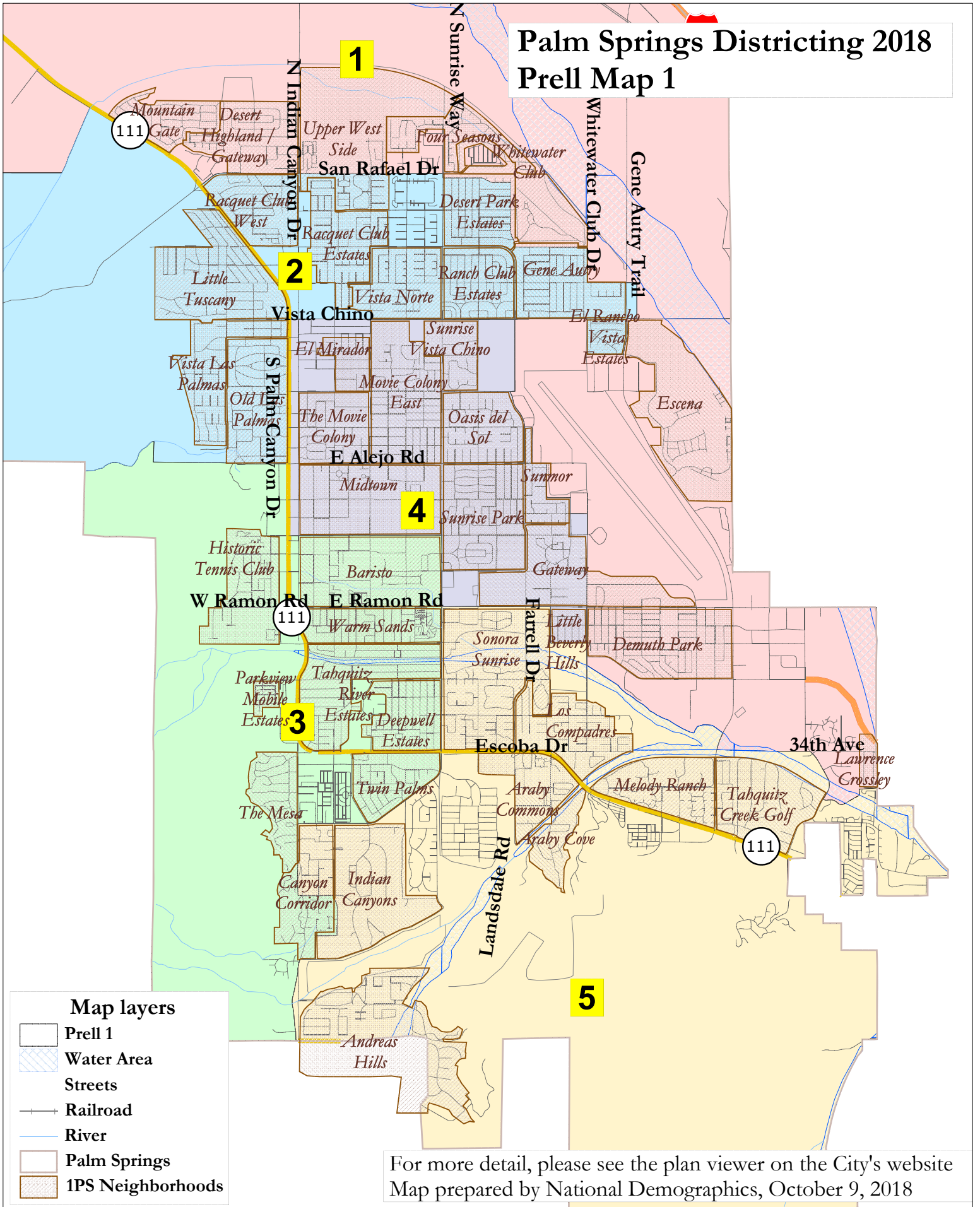


Palm Springs Districting 2018 Prell Map 1


