

Map 4 B- 4 Districts + At-Large Mayor - Typography (Racquet Club Estates intact)

District communities of interest in this map are organized around major typographical features of the city — mountains, airport/hospital, open spaces/greenways and the Whitewater River wash/levee. The Mayor would be elected at large. Only one district (Chino/Whitewater) has a total population where minorities in the majority (64.8%) but this dissipates to only 37% when only citizens of voting age are considered. This is due to the large drop-off of latinos in the total population who do not qualify as voting age citizens (e.g., children, green card holders, other immigrants without voting privileges, convicted felons)

District 1 - Whitewater - Northernmost district comprising census areas east of Rte. 111 along the Whitewater River wash/levee and its northern tributaries of Garnet Wash & Mission Creek until it meets Palm Canyon wash to the south. Southern boundary runs along Rte 111 until it meets Racquet Club Road then east to Sunrise Way (adjusted for Racquet Club Estates neighborhood boundary) then south to Vista Chino Road until east of the Airport. One-PS neighborhoods are kept intact. Minority populations comprise the majority percentage of the total population as cited above and include the following One-PS neighborhoods:

District 2 - Airport/Hospital - All neighborhoods west from the airport between Vista Chino and Ramon Road to Sunrise Way, plus those neighborhoods south of Racquet Club to Tachevah Drive west to Indian Canyon Drive with the exception of the Movie Colony. District 2 also includes the Demuth Park neighborhood to keep total district populations within acceptable deviation from other districts. Majority district per CVRA. This district would include the following One-PS Neighborhoods:

District 3 - Greenway - Joins communities on both sides of Tahquitz Creek from Palm Canyon Drive to confluence with the Palm Canyon wash and then on both sides of that to its confluence with the

Whitewater wash. Would also contain Twin Palms neighborhood to keep total district populations within acceptable deviation from other districts. Majority district per CVRA which would include the following One-PS neighborhoods:

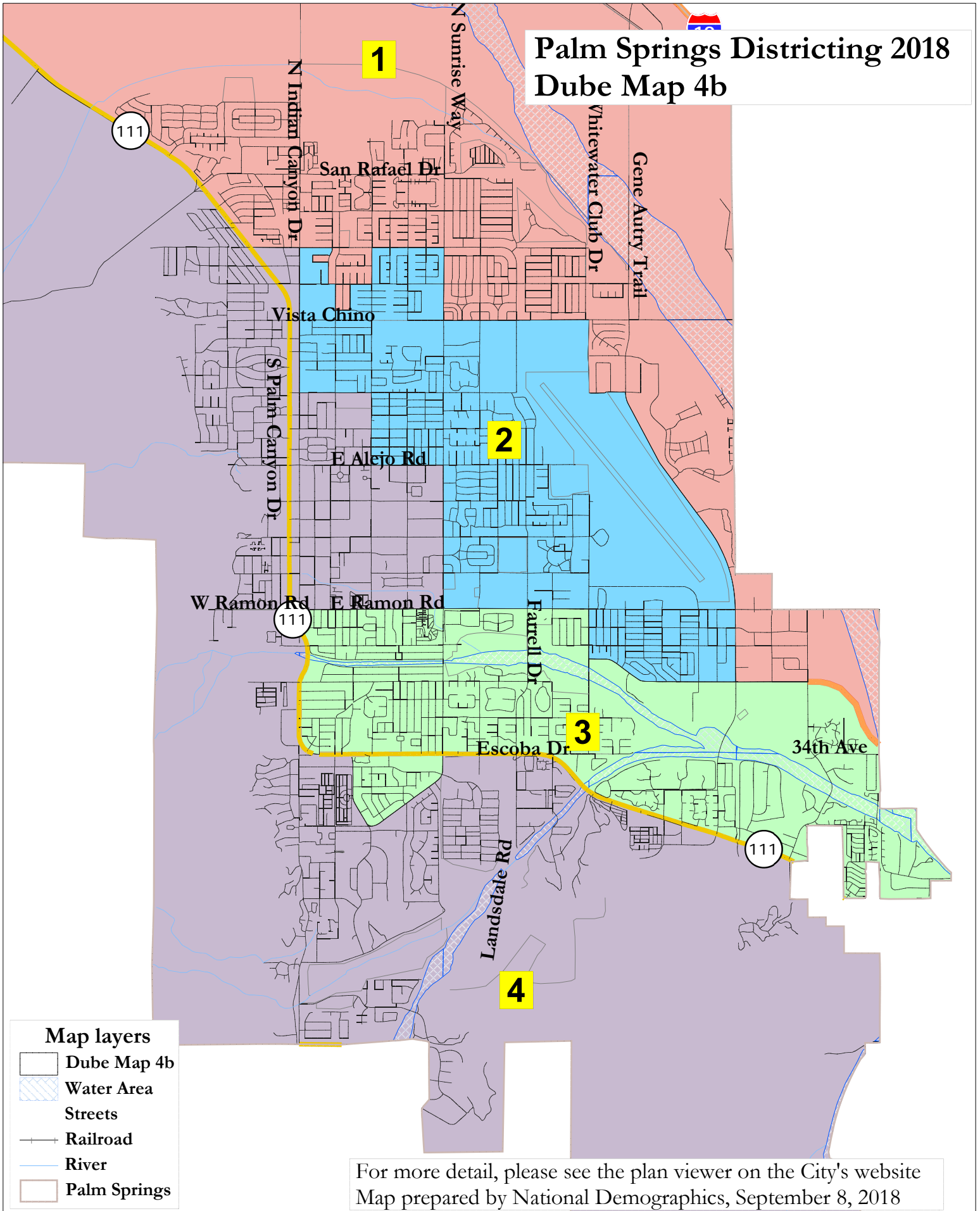






District 4 - Mountains - Joins all mountain communities west and south of Rte 111 (except for the Twin Peaks neighborhood included in District 3) and downtown neighborhoods in business district between Palm Canyon Drive and Sunrise Way. Would also include northern tributaries of San Geronio River and Snow Creek. Majority district per CVRA containing the following One-PS Neighborhoods:
